

Dodgy* evaluation of “Expert” report on car parking exemption for permit:

Receive 1 point for each dodgy method used ie max score 9, with extra added for new technics -

Use only one count during the day, and one at night, for the ‘survey’.	
Use a non busy day, either weather, or something else like holidays etc..	
Use a non-representative time for the survey, particular just before or after it gets busy.	
Use a time for the survey that does not correspond to the main use time of the application use.	
Add statement that visitors/residents will use public transport, but don’t support the statement with any facts/figures or reasonable rational reason.	
Make up car parking spaces that don’t exist. Particularly useful to show car parking spaces are always available.	
Lie about the characteristics of parking in the area, particularly if they are already extreme problems in the area.	
Ignore any facts or evidence that will show the application in a bad light.	
Advanced: Build over your existing car park, making sure you do not identify it as such in your permit application.
